Discover Hawaii



Day 1-3 : Oahu

Day 1 - Honolulu

Honolulu arrival and lei greeting. Transportation in a luxury motor coach for a narrated scenic drive past downtown Honolulu into the heart of Waikiki to our accommodations for the next four nights. We'll enjoy a get-acquainted dinner this evening.

Taste of Honolulu

Breakfast at Duke's Canoe Club on world famous Waikiki Beach. A sightseeing tour of Honolulu which includes Pearl Harbor, downtown Honolulu, Punchbowl and much more! Experience why Hawaii is such a unique place to live.

Iolani Palace, Chinatown & the Bishop Museum

Tour Iolani Palace, which from 1895 to 1969 housed the state government. Lunch in Honolulu's colorful Chinatown and explore the Bishop Museum. Discover Hawaii's history and living culture, learn about the Hawaiian Ali'i (royalty), gods and Polynesian wayfinding.



Day 4-6 : Hawaii Island

Day 2 - Hawaii Island and Volcano National Park

Depart for Hilo on the "Big Island" Hawaii's youngest and largest of the Hawaiian Islands. Travel to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, explore the Visitor's Center and a drive along Crater Rim Drive stopping at Kilauea Overlook, the steam vents, Thurston Lava Tube and more. Enjoy a picnic lunch and then to Rainbow Falls and Big Island Candies.

Day 3 - Pahoa and the Land of Frozen Fire.

Journey to historic Pahoa Town to see lava fields and walk a trail through what appears to be a petrified forest. View the newest black sand beach where once was an old boat harbor.

Day 4 - Hilo to Kona

Leave Hilo for Kona and drive up the Hamakua Coast to a Hawaiian Vanilla Plantation to enjoy a tour of the farm. Visit Waimea and Parker Ranch - one the oldest ranches in the United States. In the evening, snorkel with the Manta Rays.





Day 7 : Hawaii Island (Kona)

Day - 7 Kona Coffee Farm and Place of Refuge

Following breakfast this morning visit a Kona Coffee Farm to learn how this world-famous cup of coffee gets from the field to your cup. Travel down into Kealahou Bay at Pu'uuhonua O Honaunau "The Place of Refuge" to visit a real Heiau and learn about the Kapu System. Journey 12 miles down the Kona Coast to Captain Cook's monument while a local historian shows us over 50 points of interest on our sunset dinner cruise.



Day 8-10 : Maui

Day 8 - The "Valley Isle" of Maui

Leave Hawaii Island and fly to the island of Maui. Head to the top of the world aboard our luxury minibus to climb the world's largest volcano Mt. Haleakala. We will travel from the ocean below to the clouds above at an elevation of 9,740 feet. We head back down through pineapple and sugarcane fields, past Pukalani, Makawao, Haiku, Paia, and Ho'okipa Beach Park where the wind surfers take flight into the air. Lunch will be enjoyed at a local eatery. Then through Wailuku and Kahului into Iao Valley, home of I'ao Needle, lush tropical gardens, and a stone likeness of John F. Kennedy. We continue our drive to Kaanapali Beach for a 3-night stay.



Day 9 - Maui Honeybee and Farm Tour

This morning we'll learn the A, 'Bee', C's of honeybees and the importance they play in agriculture. We tour a working farm, and we learn about their stewardship model of soil fertility, composting, animal husbandry and beekeeping. We'll stroll through the banana, citrus, avocado and apple orchards and enjoy the vegetable and flower gardens and savor the farm's delicate honey.

Day 10 - Maui Ocean Center Experience - Ocean Aloha

Ocean Aloha is marine conservation program in support of further educating on the importance of caring for our natural resources for future generations. Through Hawaiian culture, we will learn and celebrate the cultural and spiritual traditions from the moana (ocean) and the 'āina (land) that feeds them. We'll learn how we all can mālama (care for) natural resources through simple and mindful sustainable practices. This afternoon we'll attend a traditional Hawaiian luau sampling local food, taking part in cultural activities like lei making and games and of course watching the Polynesian dancing - Hula plays and enormous part of the Polynesian culture, called upon to tell stories both mythical and factual.
